- Connecting elders and loved ones to the faith community of their choice, or other spiritually nourishing resources such as prayer, music, relaxation and visualization, nature walks, journaling, reminiscing, or storytelling.

What is Mercy Care for the Adirondacks?

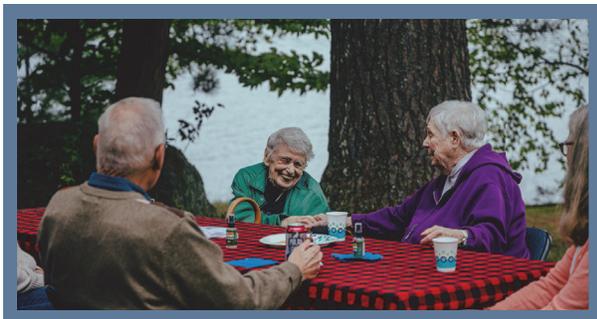

Local health departments play a crucial role in protecting and improving community health by providing services like disease prevention, health education, and emergency preparedness.

You will find additional details on programs and resources that local health departments offer in the next sections.

Health Education

Health education offered by public health departments teaches individuals and communities about healthy behaviors, disease prevention, and available resources, empowering them to make informed decisions and improve overall well-being.

Early Intervention Services

Early intervention helps children (birth to 3 years of age) with developmental delays or disabilities by providing support and services at a young age, which can improve their growth, learning, and future success.



Immunizations

Immunizations are important because they help prevent serious diseases, protect vulnerable individuals like infants and the elderly, and contribute to overall public health by reducing the spread of illnesses.

Rabies Program

Rabies is a dangerous disease that can be passed from animals to humans, so vaccinating pets and other animals is crucial to prevent the spread of this deadly virus and protect both animal and human health.

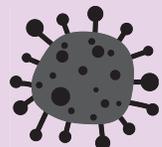


Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

New York State WIC program provides healthy food, nutrition education, and support to low-income families, helping ensure that mothers and young children have the resources they need for proper growth and development.

Communicable Diseases

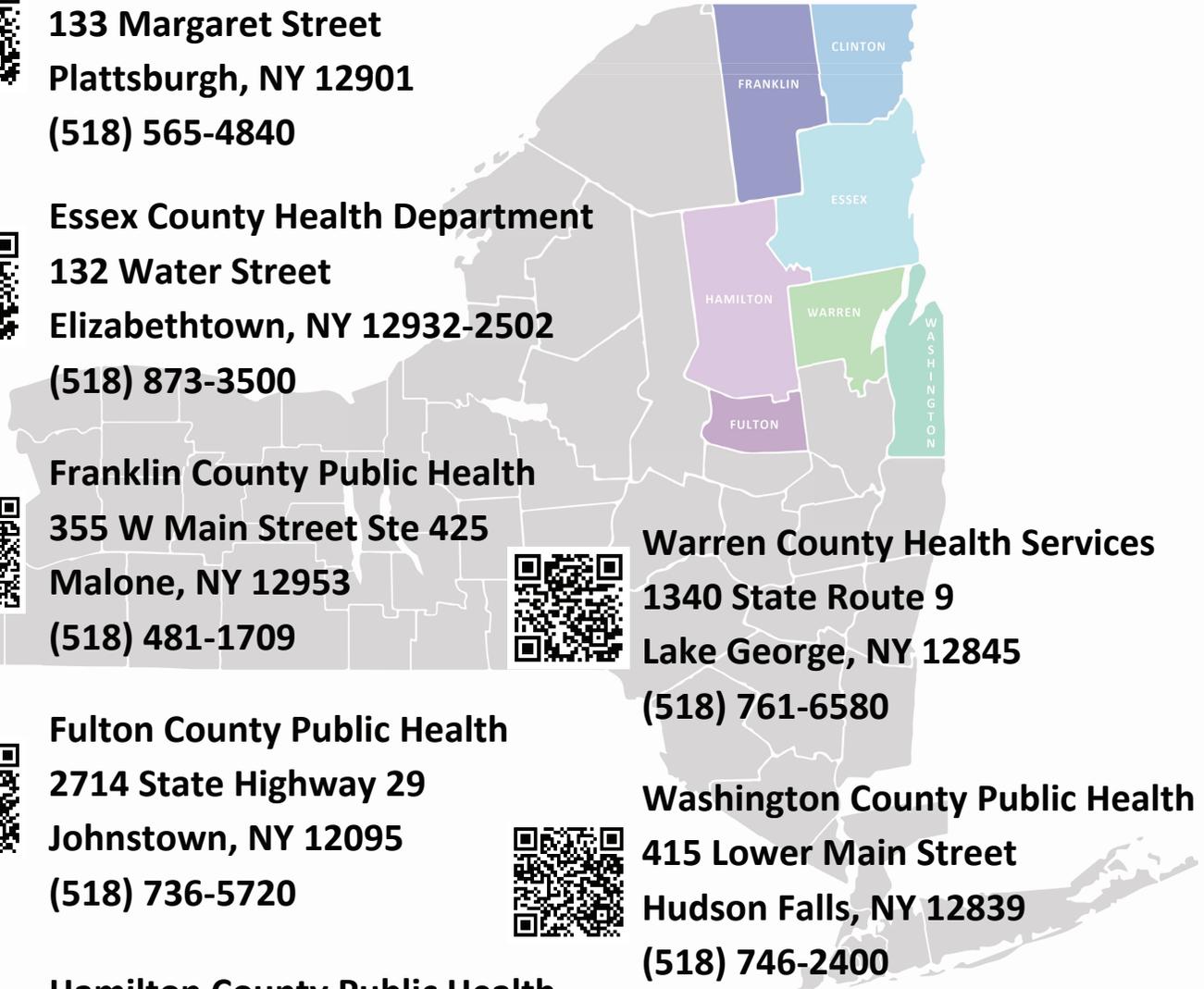

CAREGIVER SUPPORT

Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementias



Free services available in Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Hamilton, Warren, & Washington Counties



The Alzheimer's Disease Caregiver Support Initiative (ADCSI) is a program for caregivers in the North Country of New York State that offers support and direction to those caring for individuals with Alzheimer's disease & other forms of dementia. All services are available at no cost through grant funding; there are no insurance or income requirements for enrollment.

What Services are Available?

Caregiver Assessments: Caregiver assessments include planning, troubleshooting, follow-up, education, and support for the caregiver and/or family members of people with Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia.

Education and Training: Education and training are available to help caregivers of individuals with dementia to increase their skills and wellness. We offer online training as well as in-person workshops. Education programs are offered in collaboration with the Alzheimer's Association of NENY.

Project Lifesaver: Project Lifesaver will be offered to individuals with dementia who are at risk of wandering. A small, personal transmitter can be worn on the wrist or ankle, allowing local authorities to track missing persons using radio frequency.

Support Groups: Caregivers can share ideas and experiences with other caregivers and family members of people with dementia. Memory Cafés feature light refreshments, a social hour, creative art projects, or group activities for individuals with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia and their caregivers.

In-Home Fall Prevention: Free assessments are available through a trained specialist to maximize in-home safety and reduce the number of injuries sustained by common fall hazards.

Caregiver Wellness: The Wellness Program encourages support and engagement between caregivers through activities designed to promote emotional and/or physical well-being. These activities focus on the following categories of wellness: physical/relaxation; cognitive stimulation/learning; diet/nutrition; and social engagement. Activities may include weekly participation in classes such as tai-chi, while others might occur on a monthly or seasonal basis, such as cooking classes and museum visits.

Music & Memory: Music has been proven to increase communication and reduce agitation and behaviors associated with anxiety. Through this evidence-based program, a Caregiver Wellness Specialist will download songs to a music player based on the preference of the individual with dementia.

Respite: Respite offers relief to caregivers who provide care and support to people with dementia. Respite allows caregivers to safely leave their homes for short or long periods while a respite provider* delivers care. Respite can include overnight stays and is provided by volunteers or paid individuals. Respite may be provided in a recipient's home, an adult day program, or another residential facility. Respite through ADCSI is designed for occasional use and is issued on a case-by-case basis. ****Employment opportunities are available for respite providers at \$20/hr.***

Advocacy – Advocacy at the Federal, State, and Local levels on behalf of older adults and caregivers

Benefits Counseling – Assistance with obtaining services, including application assistance for various programs and health insurance counseling.

Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly (EISEP) – Case management and in-home services such as housekeeping and personal care to frail/disabled residents.

Caregiver Resource Center – Assists family caregivers of the elderly with information, referral, respite, training, support, counseling, and lending library.

Legal Assistance – Priority legal matters include housing/utility issues, access to public benefits (Social Security, SSI, SNAP, etc.), abuse/neglect, healthcare proxies, and consumer issues.

Home Delivered Meals – Meals delivered to the homes of older adults who are homebound, isolated, or unable to cook for themselves.

Congregate Meals – Dining sites serve nutritious midday meals along with socialization, education, and recreational opportunities.

Nutrition Counseling and Education – A registered dietician assists older adults in making informed dietary decisions

Transportation – Rural Zone Transit via public transit or rides to medical appointments via volunteers.

Senior Outreach – Links older adults to services by meeting at your home, the agency office, or another public location.

Health Promotion – A variety of exercise programs are provided

Personal Emergency Response System – wearable device to summon help

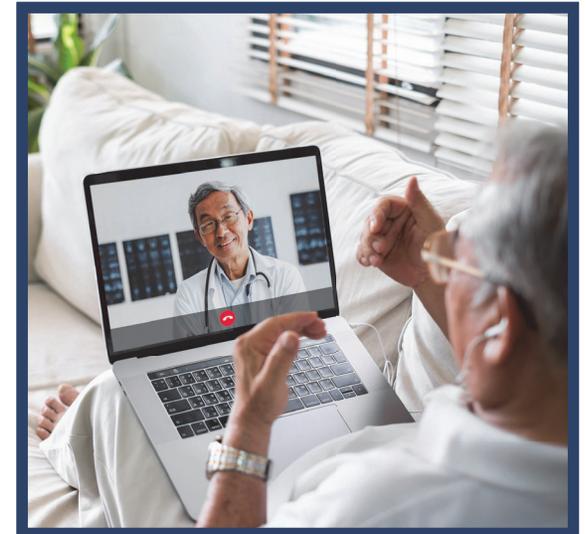

Your tablet will come to you loaded with educational videos about your health conditions. Watching these videos will help you better manage your health.



Tracking your health:

Your vital signs (blood pressure, pulse rate, oxygen level and temperature) are measured using accessories that link to your tablet. Vital signs are automatically sent out to your personalized health platform. Your platform is monitored by the telehealth coordinator and the patient's nurse case manager.

- Reports that recap your vital signs
- Tracks your exercise
- Send wound pictures sent to a specialized nurse

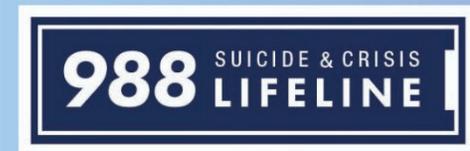

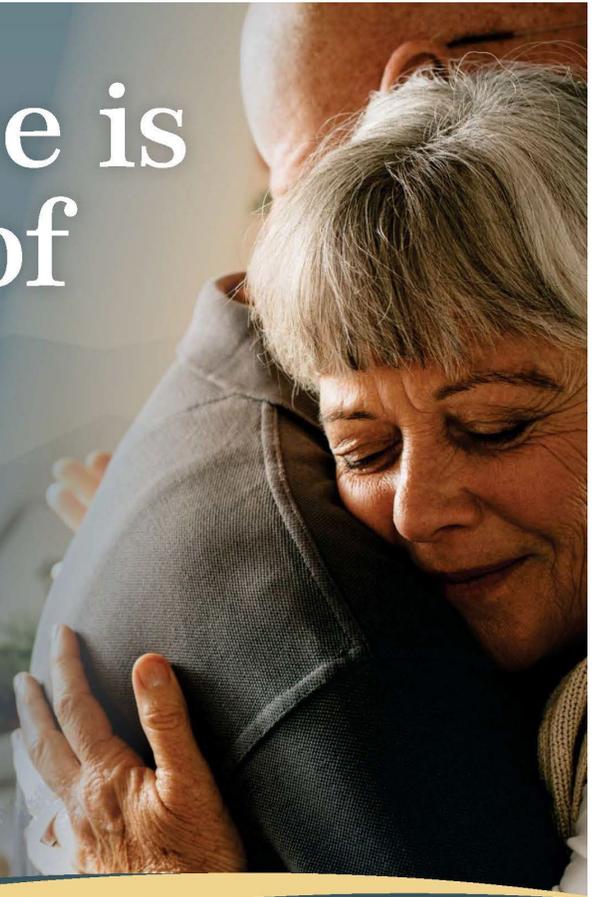

NORTH COUNTRY HOME SERVICES

North Country Home Services, Inc. (NCHS) is a New York State Licensed Home Health Care Service Agency (LHCSA) which has been providing home health care in the Adirondacks and surrounding region of Northeastern New York State since its incorporation in 1982. We provide home health care and community support services directly to clients by contracting with the client or their family for services which they pay for privately and in some cases can bill their long-term care insurance for reimbursement. North Country Home Services has a sliding fee scale for those who qualify for a reduced rate. We also provide home health care and community support services through contract with Long Term Medicaid Managed Care Companies and several government-based home care provider agencies which are generally funded through Medicaid, Medicare, or Office for the Aging. Additionally, NCHS provides traumatic brain injury and nursing home transition and diversion waiver services.

North Country Home Services has a New York State Department of Health approved Home Health Aide Training Program and an approved Personal Care Aide Training Program. NCHS also has an approved HCSS Training Program for the NHTD and TBI Waiver Programs. Training programs are conducted at all four of North Country Home Services office sites.

What is Home Care?

The scope of home care is very broad and is a range of both medical and supportive services provided in a patient's home. Home care services include care provided by professional clinicians and paraprofessional care givers. The following are some of the clinical services that may be provided in a home by professional clinicians:

Skilled Nursing
Case Management
Medication Management

Physical Therapy
Occupational Therapy
Speech- Language Therapy

The following are some of the supportive services that may be provided in a home by paraprofessional caregivers include, but are not limited to the following:

Home Health Aide (HHA)

Assistance with bathing, dressing, toileting, and continence
Aid in ambulation or transfers
Active and passive exercises
Assistance with medical equipment and routine health monitoring
Assistance with special diets
Assist with simple dressings

Personal Care (PC)

Prepare and Serve meals
Assist with care of teeth and mouth
Assist with grooming/dressing
Assist with bathing, bed, tub, and shower
Assist with toileting
Assist with transferring
Light housekeeping duties
Shopping for patient
Assist with laundry

Chore Companion/Housekeeping

Provide companionship and conversation
Monitor eating habits
Play cards and games
Prepare and pre-prepare meals
Make beds/change linen
Provide for respite care
Assist with taking a walk

Care for houseplants
Escort for shopping and errands
Check food expirations
Help with laundry and ironing
Accompany to medical appointments
Letter writing and correspondence
Assistance with entertaining

Who Needs Home Care?

A wide variety of people of any age benefit from and receive care at home including people discharged from hospitals who frequently need short-term care as they recover. Among the older population, most prefer to age in place at home despite any age-related health challenges they may have. Assistance with daily living activities allows them to do so for far longer than would be possible if they had no help. Younger adults who are disabled can choose care at home and generally prefer to receive care in the least restrictive environment as possible.

Who Provides Home Care?

There are different types of home care agencies that provide services to patients. The New York State Department of Health sets standards for and regulates all home care agencies that provide health, medically related services, or “hands on” personnel care to people in their homes. New York State Department of Health regulations and standards require that home care providers meet certain standards of care including paraprofessional (aide) training, quality of care and consumer protection standards including delivery and personnel requirements.



Types of Home Care Agencies



Licensed Home Care Services Agencies

Licensed Home Care Services Agencies (LHCSA) are approved for licensure by New York State Department of Health pursuant to State Public Health Law Sections 3605 and 3611-a and Part 765 of Title 10 NYCRR. LHCSA's offer home care services that can include all levels of nursing care, various therapies as well as home health aides and personal care aides to clients who pay privately, have private insurance coverage, or are covered through a variety of government payers. Many LHCSA's deliver services under contract with local departments of social services (DSS), certified home health agencies (CHHA) or other service-authorizing agents; in particular, services through Medicaid Managed Care and Medicaid Managed Long Term Care, Medicaid Fee for Service, Medicare Home Health Aide, Nursing Home Transition and Diversion Waiver (NHTD), Offices for the Aging Expanded In-home Services for the Elderly Program (EISEP), and Veterans Administration.

Certified Home Health Agencies (CHHA)

CHHA's provide care and support services to individuals who, for the most part, have home health care needs for a limited duration. CHHA's offer skilled nursing and home health aide services, and provide or arrange for other professional services, including physical and occupational therapy, speech pathology, medical social work, and nutrition services. They are generally reimbursed through Medicare and/ or Medicaid or private insurances. CHHA's may bill MEDICARE directly. LHCSA cannot bill MEDICARE directly. Some CHHA's employ their own Home Health Aides and others subcontract with LHCSA for the provision of aide services and/ or nursing supervision of the aide.

Hospice and Palliative Care Agencies

Hospice and Palliative Care Agencies provide home and inpatient care and counseling for the terminally ill and their families. The goal is to prevent and relieve patient suffering rather than treating the disease. These agencies provide terminally ill persons and their families with physical, psychological, social, and spiritual support and care.

Who pays for Home Care Services?

Home Care Services are paid for through a variety of sources, including Medicare, Medicaid, New York State Office for the Aging (EISEP), Veterans Administration, Health Insurance Plans, Long -Term Care Health Insurance Plans, Workers' Compensation and Self Pay.

Who do I call to Get Started?

There are many different directions one can take to get started to determine if home care is the right choice and to determine what types of home care services are needed by an individual a good place to start is by contacting any of the following:

- New York Connects or your local Office for the Aging
- A local home care provider agency (NCHS) directly and ask for an assessment of needs
- Your physician's office and ask for a referral to a home care provider agency.
- The Veterans Administration if you are a veteran to determine eligibility for home care.
- Your local Senior Citizens Center who may provide information to you regarding home care options in your area.
- Your local County Department of Social Services or your local County Department of Health Nursing office.
- If you are hospitalized ask your physician, staff nurse or discharge planner.

SENIOR SCHOLAR

Creating challenging, stimulating, and satisfying programs for older adults and enhancing opportunities for social connections through learning

THE PROGRAM

Senior Scholar was inaugurated in 2013 with the desire to create a challenging, stimulating, and satisfying program for older adults. Along with its educational component, the program sought to enhance social contact for a segment of the population often more isolated than it might like. We also wanted to partially fill a wintertime activity void.

The impact of COVID necessitated a change to a virtual Zoom-based format for several years. When the pandemic restrictions eased, our audience was surveyed to gauge its preferences for the future. Results were almost even between the desire for resumption of in-person sessions and the continuation of Zoom.

With increased demand, the program expanded to twice a year. We now offer a five-week in-person session in the fall, and Zoom-based format during the winter

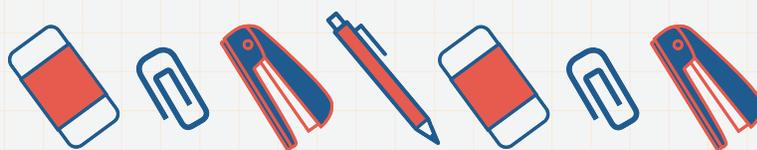
Our offerings are unique in that we offer a five-to-six session integrated course rather than isolated lectures. This allows attendees and session leaders a chance to get to know each other. Our leaders are qualified instructors from academic, government, and other professional and community environments.

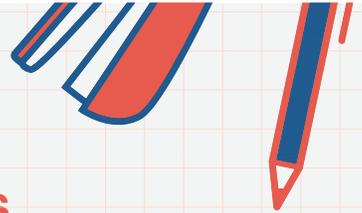
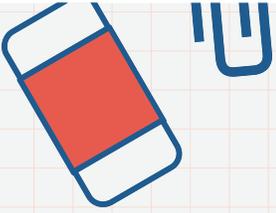
IN PERSON SEMINARS

During our fall in-person program, enrollees are offered a selection of 3-4 small group seminars that meet one morning a week for 5-6 weeks. Past topics have ranged broadly and included choices in literature, local and world history, medieval European society, archaeology, climate science, and much more. We've had courses on witch trials in Europe, the Black Plague, Adirondack Environmental History, and the evolution of human rights.

Attendees from all the seminars gather together for lunch. After this we have an afternoon program for the full group, either a five-session course (recent examples are History of American Popular Music, and Update in Genetics), or five sessions on a related topic (recent examples have included Area Waterways, and Artists' Creative Processes).

The fall program is held at a venue in Plattsburgh. We've had our share of "commuters" over time, with participants from Jay, Saranac Lake, Lake Placid, Westport, and other nearby communities.





SENIOR SCHOLAR

ZOOM BASED PROGRAMS

Winter Zoom-based programs are somewhat different. A choice of seminars is still offered, but all seminars are not at the same time. Thus, an enrollee can take more than one session. Naturally, there's no gathering for lunch.

One regular component of the winter program is our popular Virtual Museum offering. Each week's session comes live from a museum, sometimes within the region, but on occasion from a regional or national venue. Offerings in the past have included the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky, and the Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, New York.

The winter program, of course, is easily attended from anywhere, as long as a participant has a computer and internet access for the Zoom sessions. We've had people sign in from throughout the North Country, and from as far away as Kentucky and Florida.

COST

We work hard to keep costs low. For our fall programs, which include a choice of morning seminar, lunch, and attendance at the afternoon program, tuition currently runs about \$80, probably not more than it would cost to go out for five lunches. Winter programs run about \$30 for a choice of two sessions.

SIGNING UP

Publicity for programs usually begins about six weeks in advance. Since we limit the size of seminars, some fill to capacity sooner than others. Thus, we urge early sign-up to assure getting your preference of topics

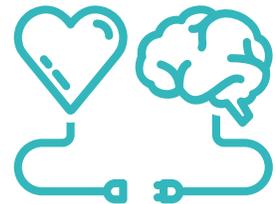

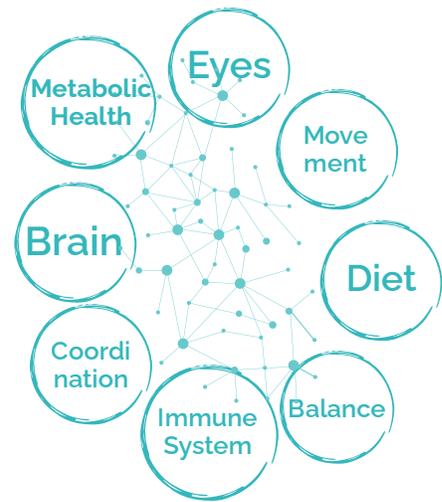
